MCDC Holds Annual Meeting Optimistic for 2010

On August 21, MCDC conducted its annual meeting at Papa Joe's Gourmet Market in Rochester Hills. During the meeting, MCDC gave an update on progress for 2009 and also expectations for next year which are cautiously optimistic as it appears loan volume is returning to historical levels.

This year's loan production was certainly given a jump start by the subsidy of the SBA fees that were a part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. These fee subsidies can save borrowers nearly \$10,000 on a loan of \$500,000. Subsidies are still available, but are expected to run out before the end of 2009, so call MCDC to take advantage of these subsidies on a new project today.

AG Manufacturing and MCDC Work Together to Keep Jobs in Michigan

ocated in the heart of Michigan's thumb, AG Manufacturing assembles electrical wire harnesses and electronic sub-assemblies for the automotive, aerospace and military industries. The company was created in 2004 when Victor Edozien acquired a business in Harbor Beach that was transferring all of its production to Honduras and Mexico.

With financing from MCDC, Edozien was able to acquire the business, keeping and increasing manufacturing jobs in Michigan. Down to 19 employees when the acquisition occurred, AG Manufacturing now has more

than 70 employees. The business is housed in a 55,000 square-foot facility featuring 12 front offices, a large conference room and four truck bays. The Harbor Beach facility is focused on aftermarket service parts, prototypes, molded components, dyno cables and electrical assemblies. AG Manufacturing's customers include Chrysler, GM, Volvo, the United States Air Force, United States Army, and Audiovox.

AG Manufacturing has been successful thanks to Edozien's vast experience in strategic planning, revenue growth strategy, acquisition strategies and business improvement in private equity/leveraged buyout situations. His additional experience with automotive supply chains and competitiveness improvement made owning his own manufacturing company an easy transition, thanks to MCDC.

"Working with MCDC significantly reduced the risk out of investing in my business for Chemical Bank," said Victor Edozien, AG Manufacturing owner. "Without their assistance in securing financing, acquiring my business would not have been possible."

Since acquiring and developing AG Manufacturing in 2004, Edozien also has acquired other manufacturing businesses in Illinois and Alabama, furthering the manufacturing industry in Michigan and across the country.
